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Temporal anomalies in and near Farnham, Surrey

Interim report prepared by agent T.M-K

STATUS: TIMESPILL CONFIRMED.

I have become increasingly certain over the last week that a complex, multi-era timespill is active in this area.

This appears to be a **very** significant timespill, and I am grateful to multiple residents of Farnham and surrounding area (Waverley Borough) who have taken on the task of monitoring and reporting suspected chrono-displacement, and engaging directly with other-era visitors. Nonetheless this is a situation of genuine concern, in which further support and resources from the Department are urgently needed.

Evidence gathered:

We have reports of earlier-era cars and bicycles, including sightings of a suspected chrono-displaced blue car near the top of Downing Street, and a succession of early-era cars circling Farnham's one-way system in a manner which suggested their drivers were unfamiliar with contemporary traffic flow arrangements.

We have reports of seasonally atypical insect / small animal activity including unusual quantities of flies (both fruit and bluebottle), wasps, butterflies, gnats and spiders and an excess of both owl- and fox-related noise.

We have an instance of a postbox disappearing entirely, only to reappear shortly afterwards – this would be consistent with a time portal having opened in the space occupied by said postbox.

We have reports of a pipe-smoking gentleman sighted in Bourne Woods, era unclear; this may or may not be the same man seen with top hat and pipe outside the Barley Mow pub. There are also reports of a man rolling a barrel; it is unclear whether this can be related to a contemporary brewery.

We have reports of a shellsuit-wearing neighbour in Bentley, some 4 miles west of Farnham. This indicates that the timespill activity may be spreading from its assumed epicentre at a faster rate than would be expected. Both shellsuits and neighbour are being monitored.

We have sightings of a figure on horseback near a local pond, and of several possibly Roman-era men on horseback in Bourne Wood. We have sightings including photographs of a man in Saxon-era military armour who did not speak or understand contemporary English but who indicated he had lost his sword, helmet and shield, and who was concerned about the presence of Vikings. Some understood his name to be Hedin. I note that a clash between Saxon and Viking armies occurred at The Battle of Farnham (892 AD) under the leadership of Edward, son of Alfred the Great.

We have reports of people attired in Victorian-era dress at Farnham Museum; they may have been mistaken for history enthusiasts.

We have multiple reports and photographs of a lady in Georgian-era clothes, who said her name was Abigail. She was reported to be looking for Emma, Lady Hamilton, in order to warn her against a “Lord Nelson” (presumed to be Horatio Nelson). Lady Hamilton and Lord Nelson are thought to have spent time together in Farnham from around 1800 until the latter’s death in battle in 1805.

We have reports and photographs of a man in an old-style pilot’s uniform who reported losing his plane following an emergency landing. This man (possibly called Brian, although this is not confirmed) was thought by some to have been involved in either the first or second World War. Others say he believed the year to be 1899, which dating would make him an early aviation pioneer – consistent with the history of nearby Farnborough airfield.

We have a potential outbreak of 1990s teenagers, and a possible sighting of a hoop-and-stick era child (female) who may also have been seen elsewhere with a skipping rope. We have reports and photographs of three ebullient young men (possibly late teens) in old-style football attire who were singing loudly, and who said they were leaving soon to fight in a war – presumed by many to be WW1.

We have an alarming account of a lethal weapon from the 1940s (sawn-off air rifle) which may have been chrono-displaced into a Farnham kitchen wall. Said weapon now in safe storage.

We have reports and photographs of a woman, possibly named Sally, whose dress suggested the early twentieth century; there is some evidence that she was from 1934. She said little and seemed mainly to want to dance.

Provisional remarks:

Although some of the above sightings may be coincidental or evidence of local eccentricity, it is impossible to ignore the collective impression: there's something going on here.

What is most notable, particularly in photographic evidence, is that chrono-displacement is occurring from multiple eras simultaneously.

Moreover, some chrono-displaced people appear not to be returning naturally to their era of origin within 24 hours of travel, as we would normally expect to happen.

This is troubling. It increases the danger of an other-era visitor becoming unduly connected with this present time, and either failing to return or returning to their era with too much retained knowledge of the future. Both could have significant consequences.

Initial analysis suggests that the portal opened in late October, though most early traffic was probably insectoid. Significant human chrono-displacement seems to have begun around the middle of November. Signs indicate that this is a Lunar Cycle Portal – in other words, the portal will close for good one month after opening, most probably on 27.11.22.

It is imperative that chrono-displaced people are given the assistance they need to return before the portal closes. Given the sweeping cuts imposed on this Department, the assistance of local residents remains crucial. Fortunately, in the process of this investigation, we have acquired some notably excellent volunteers. Even so, there is substantial risk to temporal continuity if the situation cannot satisfactorily be resolved.

The Department must take steps to provide urgent assistance, both technical and operative, if this timespill event is to be successfully managed.
